\*\*\***Things To Remember:** Look online for costume ideas. Keep the costume simple. Use Goodwill/DAV stores for cheap clothing or accessories.

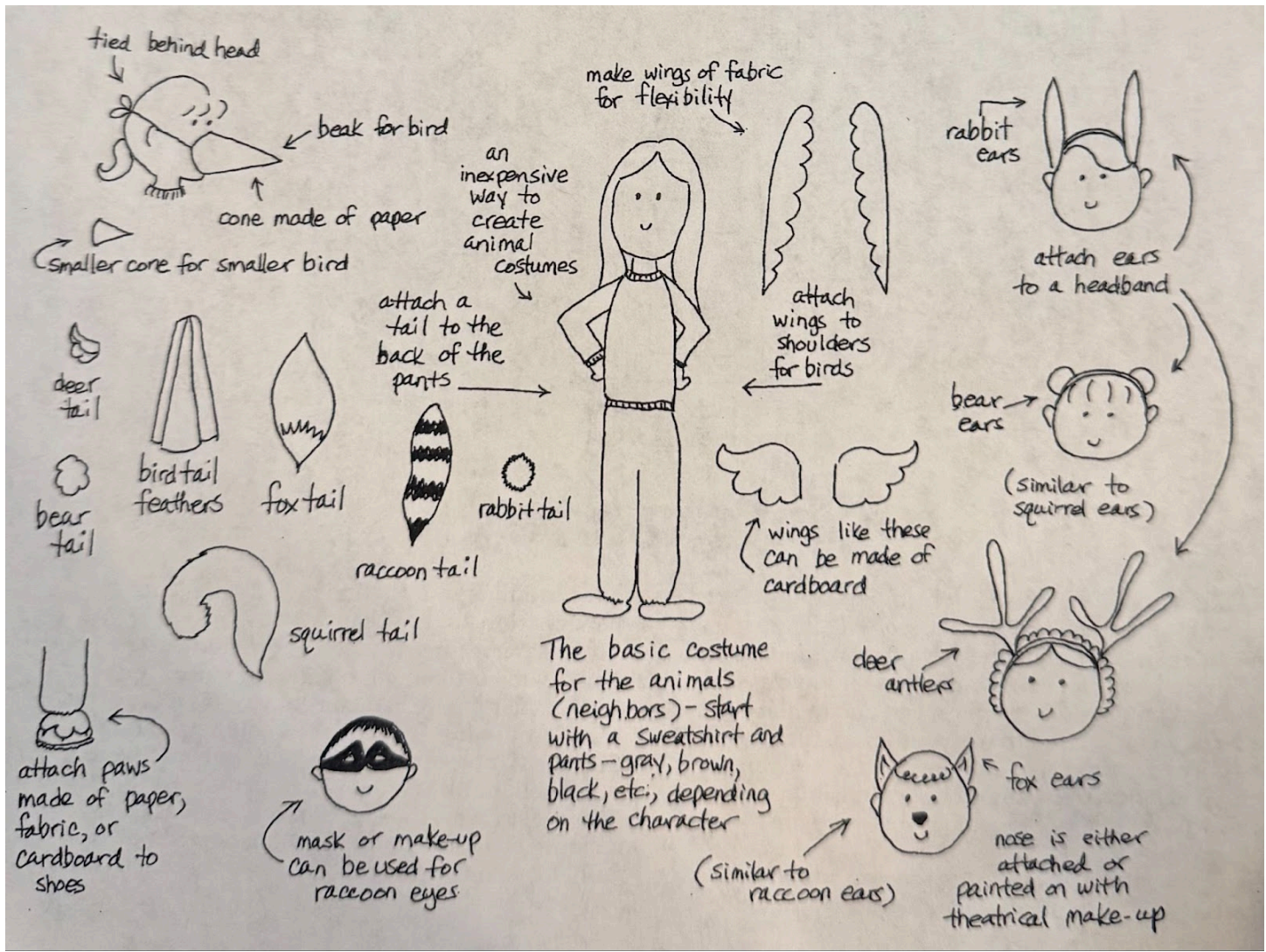
Most importantly, **HAVE FUN!!**

tied behind head

beak for bird

cone made of paper

smaller cone for smaller bird

an inexpensive way to create animal costumes

make wings of fabric for flexibility

attach wings to shoulders for birds

attach a tail to the back of the pants

wings like these can be made of cardboard

attach ears to a headband

rabbit ears

bear ears

(similar to squirrel ears)

deer antlers

fox ears

nose is either attached or painted on with theatrical make-up

The basic costume for the animals (neighbors) - start with a sweatshirt and pants - gray, brown, black, etc., depending on the character

mask or make-up can be used for raccoon eyes

attach paws made of paper, fabric, or cardboard to shoes

deer tail

bird tail feathers

fox tail

rabbit tail

raccoon tail

squirrel tail
